# World Book Day and Eisteddfod

We will be celebrating both of these events in school.We want to make sure no child is left out of either celebration and understand that that families may be under significant financial and time pressures. We will be providing fun, classroom-based activities that provide an alternative to dressing up. We aim to ensure that every child can participate in World Book Day, and can celebrate the stories they love, without an expectation for families to provide a costume. If your child would like to dress up for either event they can but they are also welcome to bring a 'prop' that would give a clue to their favourite character, access costumes and props we already have in school or wear their red school jumper. If you have pre loved costumes that your children have grown out of that we can make use of in school please donate by bringing to the school office.

### Nursery update:

We have welcomed 10 new children into our nursery and they have all settled in very well. In Nursery we have been exploring the season winter. We have enjoyed investigating ice outside and what melts ice the quickest, warm or cold water. Also the children have been looking at the book "The Polar Bear and the Snow Cloud". The children enjoyed making a friend for the polar pear. In Nursery we have learnt about polar bears and their different features. The children have been working hard practising writing their name, recognising numbers and shapes.



#### Reception update:

In Reception, our topic has been Winter. Our main class books have been 'Here comes Jack Frost' and 'Dragon loves Penguin. The children have been learning simple facts about penguins and Antarctica. They have done simple experiments on melting ice and how to make a volcano.















#### Year 1 update:



In Year 1 we have been reading the story The Little Red Hen. The children received a letter from The Little Red Hen asking for their help to make bread. They researched what ingredients are needed for making bread on a supermarket website and created a poster of the ingredients. In maths we have been discovering coins and their values. We have been exchanging 1p's for larger value coins and have had fun in the bakery role play buying bread products. We visited Cefn Mably Farm where the children had first hand experiences of a farm and we even practised animal names in Welsh on our way around. The children were extremely well behaved all day and were a credit to our school.



#### <u>Year 2</u>

In Year 2 we have continued with our Winter theme, carrying out lots of ice experiments making predictions and drawing conclusions. We have been learning about how global warming is having an effect on the polar ice caps and we created posters on how we can do our bit to slow global warming. In Literacy we have been writing our own Arctic stories and creating Winter poems. In Mathematics we have introduced the topic of money using the skills of addition and subtraction to buy items and give change in our class shop. To practise these skills we made a trip to the local ASDA to buy some treats!

















# Year 3 update:

In Year 3 we have started our new topic 'Space'. We have looked at the planets individually, finding facts and then using our chromebooks to create posters. We have been working in pairs to complete this. In our Literacy we have been writing an adventure story. We have written about explorers going to a different planet. We have had to describe the planet and decide on a 'problem' that the explorers would encounter and they need to resolve before the end of the story. We have looked at many ways that we could make our story exciting! In maths we have looked at adding and subtracting. We focused on the column method. We have now moved onto multiplication. We have used equal grouping to help us answer our questions, we have now moved onto using an array to help us answer multiplication questions, we have learnt a few gymnastics skills and we are really enjoying it. Our recent visit to Techinquest was fantastic, everyone who went was exceptionally well behaved and we really enjoyed ourselves. We enjoyed looking at the different exhibits and increasing our science, technology, engineering and maths skills!

#### Year 4 update:

In Year 4 we have started our new topic 'Discover and Explore - A World of Food'. This topic looks at the importance of a balanced diet and nutrition and the impact of our choices on our own physical health and wellbeing and the impact on our world. We started by looking at the healthy eating plate and explored a range of different fruits, evaluating them and making fruit kebabs. We have also explored where the different fruits come from and how far they have travelled. Our book for this topic 'A World of Food - Discover Magical Lands Made of Things We Can Eat!' by Carl Warner has inspired us to write poetry using prepositions and develop our use of adventurous adjectives to describe our own imaginary world made from food. We have also started to work collaboratively, in groups, to create our own fitness workouts that we will use in our PE sessions with our classmates. Year 4 also had a superb time at Techniquest, our first school trip. We explored a range of exhibits that developed our science, technology, engineering and maths skills and especially liked the hurricane simulator.

















# Year 5 update:

It has been a very busy time in Year 5 since Christmas. Our new topic of 'Discover and Explore' has enabled us to develop and enhance lots of new skills. We have been reading Michael Morpurgo's Kensuke's Kingdom and have used this to write debates and suspense stories. We have used a new IT programme 'Digimaps' to track the main characters journey around the globe. We have also used digimaps to track our journey to and from Techniquest and to map Caldicot. We also had the best day at Techniquest - we explored lots of exhibits that developed our learning, we really liked the giant slide! Even Mr Moses had a go! The rest of our topic will involve exploring and discovering what happens to our food after it enters our mouth as well as finishing off our class novel. Alongside our Topic we will be having a Diversity week and Welsh week in readiness for St David's Day.



# <u>Year 6 update:</u>

Year 6 have begun our new topic 'Discover and Explore- How To Live Forever'. This topic centres around discoveries in science and technology over the years. We have begun by learning all about the heart and circulatory system and how these function and exploring our heart rates. We have been really enjoying our book for this topic - How To Live Forever by Colin Thompson. The illustrations have inspired some wonderful descriptive writing, using adventurous words such as 'festooned', 'hue' and 'musty'. We had the best day at Techniquest also, we explored lots of exhibits that developed our learning, we really liked the giant slide! The rest of our topic will involve more exciting exploration and discoveries about living a healthy life, Victorian medicine, learning CPR and looking at the nutrition in our foods and how they help us.















#### Forest School



It was year 2's turn at the forest this term. They have bearnt all about animal habitats and had the opportunity to build their own habitat for their chosen animal. They got messy making bird feeders to hang around the forest, went on a mini beast hunt and built a new bug hotel for the forest area. The children had a great time for their fire day, the bacon sandwiches especially went down well. We would like to say a huge thankyou to the parents who donated materials for us to make our new bug hotel. A very successful and fun filled forest school had by all.



#### <u>Pupil committees:</u>

Our Sports Ambassadors have worked really hard this half term to plan and prepare a series of actions to promote the health and wellbeing of all the children in school. Their ideas include trialling the Daily Mile initiative, implementing a playground charter, structuring play into zones with non-competitive activities and leading warm-ups and games with classes to encourage participation and enjoyment. They are ready to present ideas to pupils and staff and have organised new play equipment ready to launch in the new half term. I applaud their dedication, enthusiasm and independence and look forward to seeing their plans in action after the half term break.

Our Language Leaders have been very proactive in inspiring others to use Welsh around school. They have set a challenge for the rest of the school, to create a CROESO poster that will be displayed around the school. There are prizes for the top 5 posters. The rules of the competition are - posters should be drawn on A3, should include the word Croeso (Welcome) and the school logo. Closing date for this is 23rd February.
