Welcome to Year 4, It is so lovely to welcome all of the children back to school!

Reading Books!

Reading books and records will be sent home on a Monday and should be returned to school by the following Monday. If your child finishes a school reading book before Monday then please encourage them to read their own books or library books.

Free readers are able to choose a book from the class bookshelf or may read a book from home. If they choose to read a book from home then only the completed reading record needs to be returned each week. Please ensure that you complete and sign the reading record. If the reading record in not completed then the reading book will not be changed as it will be assumed the book has not been completed. Please could you support your child by encouraging them to read 15-20 minutes a day.

Home learning

This term your child will be set weekly activities on J2E homework every Monday. The activities will include spellings to practise for a test on a Monday morning and a times tables activity, which is usually a selection of online times table games in readiness for a times table test on a Wednesday morning. It is really important that your child is as confident with times tables as possible as these facts feed into many other Maths concepts.
